#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Many of you are familiar with the Educational Foundation and the grants and awards it bestows each year. Our branches work hard to raise funds to support women who are committed to furthering their education and training. But are you familiar with another program that is administered by EF; namely the AAUW Achievement Award? Begun in 1943 by the AAUW Northwest Central Region and transferred to the AAUW Educational Foundation in 1972, these biennially awards honor women of outstanding achievement in an academic or professional field. Usually given to a mature woman whose accomplishments have spanned a number of years, these awards do not limit the recipient to any age or any field of endeavor.

The criteria are:

- · The awardee's work shall agree with the AAUW mission
- · The awardee must have national or international prominence
- · The awardee is expected to make further contributions to the lives of women
- The awardee must personally accept the award at the Foundation Night banquet during the AAUW National Convention
  Upon selection of and acceptance by a candidate, an honorarium of \$10,000 accompanies the award.

In the 64 years during which this award has been given, AAUW has brought to the world's attention the remarkable contributions made by outstanding women.

1956 Rachel Louise Carson: Author of Silent

Spring, landmark book

heralding the battle to come between

environmentalists and industry

1965 Dora Dougherty: Member of the Whirly-

Girls, an international

association of women helicopter pilots—set world records for distance and altitude

1978 Margaret Mead: World-renowned

anthropologist and outspoken leader of

the feminist movement

1983 Grace Hopper: Commodore of the US

Navy Reserve and upon retirement

was the nation's oldest active-duty officer. Coinventor of the COBOL language

1988 Sandra Day O'Connor: First woman Supreme Court Justice
