Watch the July/August Newsletter to read the Talking Points bulletin of the Pleasant Hill Recreation & Park District regarding the renovations drastically needed to its Teen Center, Senior Center, Community Center and Pleasant Oaks Park along with additional facilities throughout the district that need repairs.

The cost of renovations is beyond the size and scope of the District's operating budget and the District is making every effort to identify potential funding sources.

Although no final decisions have been made, the District is considering placing a facilities bond measure on the ballot. The last time the District placed a bond measure on the ballot was 41 years ago in 1968. The District welcomes the community's feedback and input as we continue to review all options and plans.
