

As the year ended and Congress was in recess for the holidays, AAUW remembered and was thankful for those bills that were enacted ~ the Lily Ledbetter Fair Pay Act, the creation of the White House Council on Women and Girls, a position for a White House Advisor on Violence Against Women, health care reform legislation that includes our priorities of gender rating and preventative care.

More work is always needed and our Capitol Hill Lobby Corps will remain vigilant in their volunteer advocacy, helping to pass critical legislation and holding lawmakers accountable for their votes.

Please continue to inform your legislators of AAUW's stand on the various bills that will be coming before them for a vote. Be informed!

Oral arguments for the LAF-supported case Mansourian et al. v Regents of the University of California, et al. were heard by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit in October. Kristen Galles, the plaintiffs' lawyer, said the following about the oral arguments: "It went great! Based on the questions and comments by the judges, I feel very optimistic that we will get a strong decision out of it..."
