Presidential Team Report

AAUW has gone through some changes in 2009 ~ and

there will probably be more in the future. We wanted to focus on an email received concerning our donations to AAUW Funds ~ a new name that includes LAF, Educational Opportunities (EF, to us), the Eleanor Roosevelt Fund, Public Policy and Leadership in Training.

Here are some interesting stats for the Educational Opportunities Fund during the 2009-10 funding year. AAUW gave an astonishing \$3,061,000 in fellowships and grants during that period. There were 1,175 eligible applicants for American Fellowships and 66 were funded for a total of \$1,235,000, 20% of which were women of color. There were 1,194 eligible International Fellowship applicants and 36 were funded for a total of \$715,000. Other Grants were also given; i.e. Career Development, Community Action, and Selected Professions. So, your donations are doing great things for women!

A new Eleanor Roosevelt Fund research study: Why so Few? Women in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics is ready to be published and should have a major effect on the lives of women and girls in our schoolrooms and workplaces. We are very proud to say that the **Letitia Corum** fund will be used for the publication of this research.

Public Policy Marlene Maksel

The Senate confirmed by unanimous consent the nomination of Sara Manzano-Diaz to be the director of the Department of Labor's Women's Bureau. The Women's Bureau was established in 1920 and is the only federal agency exclusively devoted to the concerns of women in the workplace. This office played a critical role in helping to reduce the gender pay gap and advocating for passage of such landmark laws as the Equal Pay Act of 1963 and the Family and Medical leave Act of 1993. AAUW looks forward to working with a strengthened and revitalized Women's Bureau to advance our priorities for working women and their families.

Equal Pay Day is Tuesday, April 20th. This is the symbolic day when women's wages catch up to men's wages from the year before. Urge your Senators to support the Paycheck Fairness Act. I have a copy of AAUW's <u>Behind the Pay Gap</u>, if anyone wants to read it and learn more about the inequities in salaries for women. For example, in the age group 45 – 64 years, women earn an average of \$44,808 per year while men in the same age group earn \$67,040.
