

Susanne Rheingruber The 2011 – 2013 AAUW CA Public Policy Priorities were approved at the state convention this month. These reflect the results of the Every Member Survey from fall, 2010, and are consistent with national Public Policy Principles. The Priorities have been developed to guide us in taking positions on women's issues and legislation in support of the AAUW mission to advance equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy and research, and can be found on our website in the Forms & Documents section under Public Policy or by clicking.

Also in the Forms & Documents section is a new Public Policy and Advocacy Workshop guide to train branch members how to communicate with legislators. This workshop is recommended for use in Leadership Training sessions offered by IBCs and branch Public Policy Chairs, and is approximately one hour in length.

Standing with the Women of Wal-Mart

Through our Legal Advocacy Fund, AAUW brought the lead plaintiffs in _Wal-Mart v. Dukes to Washington, D.C., for their hearing at the U.S. Supreme Court on March 29 and signed an amicus brief supporting their plea to argue their gender discrimination case as a class. AAUW also co-hosted a reception in their honor, attended the oral arguments, and co-led a rally outside the court.

Obama Administration Takes Action for Sexual Assault Awareness Month and You Can,



Last week the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights issued <u>guidelines</u> on sexual violence in schools. The guidelines make clear a school's obligation to prevent and respond to sexual violence under Title IX's provisions on sexual harassment. The department also recently announced that it is investigating a sexual harassment complaint by students at Yale University. AAUW's Lisa Maatz was interviewed by *Good Morning America* about the case.

Giving Circle Muriel Fry

A late evening email from Sharon Schuster delivered some good news:

1) The end of year appeal by AAUW Funds garnered \$57,580 from over 1,000 people, many of whom were new givers. The Giving Circle matched up to \$35,000.

2) The Circle has funded for a second year the "Elect Her" project in CA at Mt. San Jacincto Community College. We also funded a second project at W WA University. We are looking for another campus in CA.

3) Funds for the Giving Circle are coming from non- Giving Circle members too. A branch contributed some of their funds to be directed to the Giving Circle.

4) In 9 years (since 2002) the Giving Circle has raised almost \$300,000.

5) We are committed to funding printing and distribution of the new report (on Harassment) sometime this year.
