The U. S. Supreme Court recently heard arguments in *Young vs. UPS* ~ a case AAUW has been following closely. Peggy Young, a UPS driver, requested temporary light-duty work as a result of pregnancy complications. UPS refused, even though light-duty work to other drivers with similar restrictions had been provided. The court's decision won't be made until 2015, but AAUW and allies have led a rally in support of workplace protections. Watch for the court's decision.

Performing Arts School Proposed for Contra Costa County

The County Board of Education recently received a petition for the establishment of a Contra Costa School for the Performing Arts. The school, which would be patterned after the successful Oakland School for the Arts, would be a charter school open to students from all over Contra Costa County. The petition was brought by Neil McChesney who is the founder and CEO of the Charthouse Public Schools organization. McChesney was instrumental in the formation of the Clayton Valley Charter High School and is an administrator there.

The proposed performing arts school would serve about 1,000 students in grades 6-12 and would offer "pre-professional" training to students who are interested in dance, drama, vocal and instrumental music, as well as stage arts. In addition there would be a rigorous integrated academic curriculum. It is presumed that the school would be located at the Concord Pavilion and its proponents look forward to its opening in the Fall of 2015.

There were a number of interested parents and other individuals who spoke before the Board regarding the proposal. A number of questions and concerns were voiced as to the impact on other schools, how students would be selected to attend, etc.. In addition, a concern was voiced that the number of charter schools may be expanding before adequate oversight has been established for them. These questions and concerns will be addressed at a future meeting.
