POLITICS IN EDUCATION? CAN'T BE!

It's amazing what happens in Sacramento when we're not watching. It appears that the State passed SB 858 last year, which requires local school districts to cap their financial reserves at 6% of their general funds. That amount is so limiting that it would only cover about two weeks of salary payments in case of an emergency. It leaves no money for capital improvements, emergency repairs, technology, etc.. The reason behind the cap on reserves has been attributed to labor unions who allege that districts are hoarding money. They want more money spent on salary and benefit increases and less money held in cash reserves.

But all is not lost. A bipartisan group of legislators has proposed SB 799 that would raise the cap on reserves from 6% to 17%. This increase in reserves would help districts operate even in the case of future funding cuts. It would also allow districts to accept funds resulting from an improving economy and save those funds for meaningful improvement projects.
