TECH TREK TIDINGS

As we wind down this 2015-2016 AAUW year, I am delighted to bring you some fabulous news! In April we learned of the rare opportunity to send a fifth camper to this year's Tech Trek Sonoma State University camp week. Because of you we had enough money in the Tech Trek fund to do this and it was a wonderful development as the committee had a very deserving fifth candidate ready to send. So it is with great pleasure that I present our 2016 campers: Lexi Alford and Julia Beaty from Martinez Junior High School, Jazmine Cano from Valley View Middle School and Isabella Martinez and Isabella Triana both from Seguoia Middle School. I look forward to introducing them to you at our end of the year brunch on Saturday, June 4. I hope you will plan on attending so you will see your donations at work and know that, right here in our own community, your contributions are making a difference!

Because of you, this year through our fundraisers we added \$2249.29 to our branch's Tech Trek account. This includes Tech Trek's half of the \$551.36 profit from our recent sale of 67 tickets for our April 24 dinner at Tahoe Joe's. (Funds and Tech Trek split the proceeds and each received \$275.68.) It also includes Tech Trek's share of the Festa profits, \$1166.57, and a \$500 contribution of the Marathon Bridge group. Many additional donations were made by members, including over \$1000 directly deposited through AAUW into our Tech Trek account. Total camp fees were \$4900 and our only expense was the cost of our Tech Trek bears, \$70 for 5.

A very special thank you needs to be extended to Joy Barden, Shelley Jacobson, Sherrie Moore and Helen Pereira who for the past two years have made up the Tech Trek committee and to Trinka March who was always there to answer my questions and those of parents at our interview sessions.

Word is spreading about our Tech Trek program. In 2015 we had a total of 21 applicants from our four middle schools. This year we had 30 applicants. The girls who attend come back "singing the praises" of their camp experience and their teachers are listening and getting behind our program. It is unique, not only in the type of camp it is, but in the fact that it is free to the participants! All, **because of you!**





Elena Noble Start Smart Facilitator

There is good news this spring in AAUW's effort to offer Wage Negotiation Classes for Equal Pay. Since taking over the former WAGE Project, AAUW has redesigned and trained members to reach out to their local colleges and facilitate trainings for graduating college students.

By collaborating with our Inter-Branch Council of CCC, AAUW members from Pleasant Hill-Martinez, Concord, and Orinda-Moraga-Lafayette have facilitated classes at *Diablo Valley College, Cal State Stanislaus and Chico State College.* With more members getting trained, we have larger pool of facilitators available when colleges request a workshop.

The drive this year for Equal Pay for Equal Work, a raise in Minimum Wage, and passage of the Fair Pay Act, has been a big part of the current Political Lexicon. Using Social Media, National has started posting Start Smart Workshops on Face Book and Twitter.

Students have expressed appreciation that our organization makes this information available to them. One student commented:

"Wonderful, much needed information. I would not have thought to negotiate."

Another said:

"The Wage Gap is real, thank you for helping me realize I can do something about it."

Convention, Book Trackers and Off to NickWhistle!

As it turned out, we sold almost \$500 worth. We will apply some of that to our Zuhal's expenses at the National Conference of College Women Student Leaders Conference in June.

What's a Book Tracker? It's a cute little pad with stubs for the lender to keep with the book's name and the borrower since she is lying to herself if she thinks she will remember. She then tears the 'long' end off the stub with the title of the book and the owner's name on it for a handy bookmark/reminder. I wish I had had it when I loaned a treasured and irreplaceable book a few years ago sure I'd never forget who I loaned it to. You will see them at the Spring Brunch. They make great gifts as well!

But more than that, I left Sunday afternoon very happy I had broken my "rule". Sharing a room with my dear pal, former Mtz AAUW member and current Sunnyvale-Cupertino president, Judi (Foster) Pogue, was fun as always. But the three main reasons were a session on attracting young members, a free-form Open Space discussion format that is well worth attending our upcoming Leadership Training on May 21 to participate in, and an incredible Public Policy speaker who has been dealing with the reality of and the difficulty of getting justice in gender and pay inequality in our own state for 7 years. A happy ending is in sight for Aileen Rizo, her family and for all women because of her. But none of us is doing enough in that fight compared to Aileen and her family. It was a very inspiring day.

Saturday night, wow, was I surprised! when Pleasant Hill-Martinez Branch was named number 9 in the top ten branches in California in per capita giving to AAUW Fund. In addition to our normal generosity, one member, who wishes to remain private, gave a substantial donation to Charting the Course.

Instead of a Fund history note, this month the theme will be "making history". One of the new-member search sessions was chaired by Charmen Goehring of CA State Board, Sacramento Branch, Younger Members Task Force chair and immediate past member of the AAUW national Board of Directors. The topic was the Young Women's Task Force, sponsored by National and based finding a format attractive to young women in their first years out of college. She introduced a recent Stanford graduate, employed in Tech and living in San Francisco, who was interested in spending time and resources on women's issues. She found AAUW on the web and felt that the issues we fight for were exactly what she and her fellow Stanford friends were looking for. The Young Women's Task Force of AUW was formed a few years ago in the East with about half a dozen groups in cities such as New York and Chicago. The YWTF members have a reduced national membership fee and some have Branch affiliations. Besides seeking members and creating and publicizing a creative issues-oriented website, the goal of the Stanford women is to develop six-month long advocacy/education programs on various topics. The whole thing is a work in progress but a creative idea that may find a place in our future and be a successful transitional way to find members for our branches who won't be new to AAUW and what it stands for and works for. More to come on this.

By the way, I think I want to attend the National convention in Washington next year. That's a long way out of the zip codes!
