Turn <u>RIGHT</u> to stay on Alhambra Valley Rd and go 0.8 miles. Turn <u>RIGHT</u> onto Vaca Creek Rd and go 100 yds. Turn <u>LEFT</u> onto Stonehurst Dr and go 0.2 miles. 5318 is the second house on the **RIGHT**.

From Gregory Ln/Grayson Rd: Take Grayson Rd up to the cemetery. Turn <u>RIGHT</u> onto Reliez Valley Rd and go 2.2 miles. Continue straight ahead onto Alhambra Valley Rd and go 0.8 miles. Our budget is laid out before the membership each year so we can vote on it. We think our budget is reasonable and responsible. We spend money on the things we need to do to keep our branch going from year to year. Some of our expenditures are more fun than others. We do enjoy gathering each month for our programs and while we have found some amazing people to come share their stories with us at very reasonable costs, it does cost us a marginal fee for the space to meet. The expenditures like insurance are less fun, but still quite necessary.

The reality is that our budget is solely funded by our membership dues and while we pay dues to the tune of \$97 each year, only \$18 of that is our branch dues. At the time we put our budget proposal together we had 89 members on the books. The reality is that that many members does not generate the funds that we need to run the branch. We have had the privilege to have a surplus in the bank in the past few years so have pulled discretionary funds from the bank to make up the remainder of what we need to fund our budget, but at the rate we are pulling these discretionary funds we will run out in another 5 years.

We need to discuss how to make up the revenue to fund our year to year needs for our branch. We have been very good at fund raising with our generous members for our various projects such as the AAUW funds, Tech Trek and Local Scholarships, but those funds we cannot use for our day to day operation of the branch. How would you like to fix this problem? The dues for another 60 members would do it. Can you find a friend that would enjoy AAUW? A fund raiser just for our basic needs? An imaginary fund raiser? To increase dues? We do need to come up with a solution to this and now is the time to start the dialog.
