MacKenzie, a 71-year-old lawyer, relates the remarkable story of his work helping Afghans rebuild their lives and country. He recently published a book, *Off the Couch, Into* the War for Hearts and Minds. It is available on Amazon.com and the website www.trustineducation.org.




