### Carlyn Obringer, Mayor of Concord

Carlyn Obringer is the youngest female Mayor in Concord history. She was elected to the City Council in November 2016 and served as Vice Mayor in 2018. She previously served on the City's Design Review Board and the Planning Commission, which she chaired. A community leader, she has chaired the City's July 4th Parade since 2016, and founded Concord's annual Art and Wine (and Beer!) Walk. She is the former board chair of Monument Impact and the Contra Costa Commission on the Status of Women, and a past President of Soroptimist International of Diablo Vista.

Obringer has been active in many local organizations including the American Association of University Women-Concord Branch, the Concord Ambassadors, the Concord Historical Society, and the Greater Concord Chamber of Commerce.

Professionally, Obringer analyzes education policy and budgets, provides technical assistance to charter schools, and conducts Brown Act and government ethics trainings throughout the state. She holds a Masters of Business Administration from the Monterey Institute of International Studies and resides near downtown Concord with her husband, Justin, and their dog, Coco.



### AAUW FUND REPORT

Gayle Miner and Claudia Bass, AAUW Fund VPs

We are in the middle of our Kinder's sales which started October 16<sup>th</sup> and will end on November 25<sup>th</sup>. The twelve dollar coupons will be good through the end of February and are redeemable at the Pleasant Hill and Martinez stores. With each coupon you get a choice of a tri-tip sandwich, chicken sandwich or hamburger with a drink. We get five dollars for each coupon sold. In the past we have earned enough money to send a woman student from DVC to NCCWSL. Some of you heard Lily, our last student, talk at the brunch and heard how meaningful the experience was for her. Makes the sales effort worthwhile. So not only buy coupons but consider selling them to your friends. Contact Gayle Miner or Jennifer Apkarian if you are interested in selling or buying.

Four people from our branch attended the October 6<sup>th</sup> Fund luncheon in Danville. They were Helen Pereira, Trinka March, Kit Hein and Claudia Bass. It is always inspiring and interesting to hear what the grant recipients are studying as they pursue their advanced degrees and their personal stories. It puts a human aspect to AAUW Fund. What was especially exciting was part of the grant received by one of the recipients, Saalem Adera, came from Martinez Branch 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. She is attending UC Berkeley and working on her Ph.D. in hydrology (study of water). Once finished with school she wants to improve planning for access to plentiful and good quality water availability through various parts of the world.

At the luncheon, the national financial officer spoke about the need for donations to go to unrestricted funds. Funds from this category provide money to support a variety AAUW Fund programs. Restricted Funds are for educational grants and they are well endowed and can support many women students for a very long time. She provided a visual example and unrestricted funds are very much behind and needed. So consider contributing to unrestricted funds

One of the examples of the use for unrestricted funds is Campus Action Project (CAP) grants. The focus of these grants are to research barriers women have on college campuses and find ways for them to overcome these barriers. Another example is Campus Outreach Grants. Events are hosted to educate college women about unfair pay, sexual harassments and assaults as well as Title IX violations. All of these activities support the mission of AAUW.
