HOPE for Homeless Students in MDUSD

Wednesday, October 16, 2019, 7 pm St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church 1601 Mary Dr, Pleasant Hill, CA

Helping homeless students pursue their education is a full-time job for Social Worker Vivica Taylor. Coordinator of the Homeless Outreach Program for Education (HOPE) in the Mt. Diablo Unified School District, Ms. Taylor will describe the respected decade-old program at the October 16 meeting.

Most school districts use available federal funds to offer some sort of educational support to homeless students but according to a staff member, MDUSD has been singled out by government agencies such as the County Office of Education and by various non-profits for the high level of service it provides and the donations and support it organizes according to a district employee.

740 students were in the program at the end of the 2018-19 school year. So far this school year, about 360 homeless students have been identified. Students are identified by counselors and principals as well as agencies and non-profits in the community.

The program will start at 7 p.m. at St. Andrew's Church and will be followed by a short business meeting.

On November 20th, Carlyn Nobringer, Mayor of Concord, will speak on issues facing Concord and other cities in the county.
